BUILDING COMMITTEE REPORT

We are so glad that the change of seasons will allow us to open the church to the public in May. The committee continues to meet regularly. The winter months have provided good progress in a couple of areas and fitful progress in others. We have been focused on getting the church building ready for ongoing use. We hope to soon be able to turn our attention more to the many needs of the Sunshine Hall.

The age of the property along with its past use have meant that basic infrastructure needs to be evaluated and documented. For example a real survey had never been done. Even though it was winter, this was commissioned and accomplished in February at Society expense (at a special rate by Grenier Engineering of Waterbury). If you are interested in the result, it is available on the society website by pressing the "Property Documents" button. The survey will be crucial for many of the planned improvements.

In the last newsletter update we highlighted the Preservation Trust of Vermont (PTV) support for a buildings condition report. Here is another item that can be checked off the list. We are fortunate that Adam King, an expert in timber frame buildings, lives nearby in Northfield. On February 27 he inspected the property and issued his report about a month later. There was a sigh of relief from us that he did not find any major structural issues with either building. The spire and roof of the church in particular are in pretty good shape. Adam took the picture of the bell which you can see in this newsletter. There are some brickwork foundation issues on the church that need to be addressed along with other considerations such as aging windows and shutters. Failing paint is an obvious shortcoming of the Sunshine Hall. Please read the report yourself for the details. Once again, it is filed under "Property Documents" on the website. We thank PTV for covering half of the cost of this report.

We anticipate that the electrical upgrade will be done in three stages. The first stage will be upgrading the transformer to serve both buildings and adding a new panel and 240V outlets to the church. With this upgrade the function of the wood stove can be replaced with portable electric heaters. Our goal is to disturb the look of the church as little as possible while enabling its use in cool weather. The second and third stages consist of replacing the 1950's era wiring in the Church and Sunshine Hall respectively. We have received an estimate of approximately \$15,000 for all facets of the first stage. We have not yet gotten estimates for the second and third stages of this project. This electrical work is the focus of the American Rescue Plan Act money that we are requesting through the Duxbury Select-

Attention also has been paid to the need for wheelchair access. This part of the project has proven to be much more difficult than anticipated.

We look forward to hearing your opinions about the property.
